From the Kids



Eight years ago my life completely changed. My mom told me during spring break of 2004 that I would be going to sleep away camp for two months. As an 8 year old, I was very nervous. I had made so many plans with my fourth grade friends for play dates and sleepovers. My mom told me that those activities paled in comparison to the experience I would have at camp. Her idea of Surprise Lake Camp was a big open field of Judaism.

My first day at Surprise Lake was extremely eye-opening. I wrote my mom a two page letter on the very first day telling her that SLC was very different than her vision. SLC doesn't preach Judaism, and how you learn here is up to you. Judaism at camp is lived, learned, and loved.

In 1998 my father passed away from a severe heart attack. My dad, Michael, was born and raised in the Jewish religion. When he passed away, my mom converted to Judaism. She sent me to SLC to learn more about my religion as a one time thing. I ended up loving this place more than I love my own home. Camp has actually turned in to my home, and now, during the

winters, I feel away from home for ten months. It turns out that two months just isn't enough.

I hope to work in the city office one day (after I fulfill my big hopes and dreams to be a "TODAY" show anchorwoman). Camp is a part of me. I can say that not a day goes by that I don't talk about SLC, and how my life has changed. But it's not just camp life that changed me—it's the counselors, supervisors, and friends, too. My favorite quote is, "there's nothing like returning to a place that hasn't changed, only to find the ways in which you yourself have altered." That quote clearly has Surprise Lake Camp written all over it.

So many significant moments in my life took place in SLC . . . learning how to be a better swimmer, meeting my best friends, and most importantly, my Bat Mitzvah. A Bar or Bat Mitzvah is one of the most important days of any kid's life, but I feel that having it in camp makes it more special. My mom received a call three weeks before the date indicating that I wanted my Bat Mitzvah at camp. I live in Ft. Lauderdale, FL, so my mom was very hesitant to say yes, because she really wanted to be present on my special day. Camp told my mom we could set up a Skype account and that my family could watch my Bat Mitzvah live. My mom agreed, and even though it was a last minute decision, we pulled it off. The day of my Bat Mitzvah came quickly, and when I arrived at the Eddie Cantor Theatre, I was amazed and thrilled to see 13 of my family members sitting on the benches. Camp (and my mom) will really go the longest distance for their kids.

All in all, camp will forever be a huge part of my life, and I plan on becoming a part of any association I can. I will never forget this place, and I plan on sending my kids here in the future.


