

Why I Joined the 1902 Society By Michael Gurman

As an attorney, I know that estate planning is an important part of life and allows an individual to manifest their wishes and plan for the disbursement of their life's wealth. My memories of camp (as both a staff member and camper) remind me of how great environments foster good people.

Some may wonder why two months out of a whole year represented such a big part of my life. My response is simple. Anyone who attended Surprise Lake Camp knows that time moved differently while you were there. To the outside world it was two months but, for those of us at camp, those two months felt like a lifetime. Camp was its own world where we felt safe to grow. It was a place to gain confidence in sports, relationships (romantic and platonic) and who you wanted to be. It showed me that I had support when I was at my best and worst. Whether it was walking into the Eddie Cantor Theater and hearing hundreds of people scream "Gurman for Herman" or the camaraderie of teammates after losing in the finals of the Monroe Cup or feeling the support of the best staff and friends after a loved one passed away, Surprise Lake Camp always found a way to be exactly what I needed.



It is because of my experiences at Surprise Lake Camp that I want to help bring this special world to more people. I see my annual charitable giving and the 1902 Society as a way to add to Surprise Lake Camp and help fulfill its mission of shaping the lives of everyone who goes there, regardless of financial challenges. But being part of the 1902 Society isn't just about the donation of money. Over the past year, a unique partnership formed between Surprise Lake Camp alums, Brent Birnbaum and Dan Leibel. They combined their talents in comedic stand-up and creative production to host a recurring local comedy show, <u>The Pregame</u>, in a new, expressive art space in Brooklyn, New York.

Brent Birnbaum, who attended SLC from 2003 to 2008 as a camper and 2009 as a canteen connoisseur, has been performing stand-up comedy since 2016. Brent's interest in comedic performance started watching his dad perform stand-up when he was a kid. After performing in many theaters growing up, including all-camp shows at the Eddie Cantor Theater, Brent knew stand-up was something he wanted to pursue. Brent has performed stand-up in clubs and festivals throughout the country, and can be regularly seen at The Broadway Comedy Club in New York City. In June 2021, he launched The Pregame comedy show with his Co-Producer and Co-Host, Spencer Wright, as a rooftop series in New York City. This talented duo brought comedians and audience viewers together in COVID-friendly outdoor venues to provide an evening of laughs and socializing with friends.

After a successful series of rooftop shows during the summer, Brent Birnbaum partnered with Dan Leibel's <u>Giant Ledge Production Co.</u> for a run of Pregame Comedy shows held at 17 Frost Gallery in Williamsburg, Brooklyn.

Dan Leibel, camper from 2003 to 2008 and famed SLC librarian in 2009, founded the full


service creative production company, Giant Ledge Productions, in the midst of the pandemic last year. Dan's vision for Giant Ledge stemmed from his passion for music, art, and creative expression. He credits Paul Suchow with igniting his interest in guitar at SLC, a passion which ultimately led to collaboration with top NYC jazz guitarists and other musicians. Dan has years of experience working with artists, such as photographers, painters, touring musicians, recording musicians, poets and more. Now, Giant Ledge's mission is to bring art, music, and storytelling together in an accessible way to cultivate top-tier art experiences for audiences and vast platforms for artists.

The Pregame show has been called a "top ten thing to do in NYC this weekend" and "one of the best comedy shows in NYC this month" by Time Out New York, and a "comedy show to see right now" by <u>coolstuff.nyc</u>. It is also featured regularly in Nonsense NYC and Broadway World.


